Interim Update for April, 2022

Friends,

Bob Bengston, Ara Demirjian, Betty Dunn, Jon Mills, Ellen Prowant, Don Schneider and Don Swick have been busy writing the Mission Study documents for our Presbytery. Thanks again to all who helped give them information! The documents were completed during Holy Week and considered by the Session on Wednesday, April 22. As of the printing of this newsletter, the Session had not yet approved the study. When they do, we can send it on to the Committee on Ministry of the Lake Michigan Presbytery. If they approve it, we will be given permission to elect a Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC).

If all goes as we hope, you should get an invitation to a Congregational Meeting sometime in late May or early June to elect the PNC.

After the PNC is elected, they will use the Mission Study information to compile a Mission Information Form (MIF) which the denomination will use to match us with prospective pastoral candidates. Rev. Troy Hauser, pastor of the Grand Haven First Church, is the Transition Counselor for FPC Muskegon. He will work closely with the PNC.

I recognize that this process can feel tedious, cumbersome and even confusing at times. The process is meant to help us be prayerful and thoughtful in discerning our call as a congregation and looking for a pastor who is a good fit with who we are. Hang in there and continue to hold the Mission Study Group and PNC in your prayers.

My heart is very sad as I report that at its monthly stated meeting on April 20, the Session received, with regret, the resignation of our Youth and Young Families Director, Arisha Coffee, effective June 30, 2022. Her letter is on Page 3. None of us wanted to receive this!

As most of you know, Arisha has been with us for almost five years. She has cared for our children and youth, been creative in carrying out programs like VBS, Trunk or Treat, Easter Egg Hunts and more. She has served on our Presbytery's Youth Committee. She continued to develop the Moms Ministries. Her creativity, commitment, computer skills and enthusiasm helped carry us through the COVID shut down. I could list many more things she has done and relationships she has built. However, I think what I appreciate most about Arisha is her deep, vibrant and sincere faith, her integrity and work ethic and her longing to build true community and help others know the saving love of God. 
I have experienced a ton of love and support while serving here almost five years. I appreciate those who have taken time to support and encourage me in the Youth and Young Families Facilitator position.

Back in my days as a math teacher, I spent a lot of time with students looking for the answers to math problems. We learned ways of thinking, processes, formulas and more to help us get answers. It was often so fun when we got the answer! Many days I wish the life of faith was that easy. Don't you wish there were some simple formulas or easy answers to the problems and questions of living?

It gives me hope amid all the challenges of life to know that Jesus likes questions. In fact, Jesus is prone to ask questions more than he is likely to give answers in the Gospels. United Church of Christ pastor and author, Rev. Martin Copenhaver, in his book "Jesus is the Question," reports that the Gospels record at least 307 questions that Jesus asks. He is asked 187 questions and only answers 3. It seems that part of learning to live this life of faith involves being able to live with questions.

In an interim season in the life of a church there are often many questions -- Who will our next pastor be? What are we called to do and be in this season of our life together? How do we live as faithful people in a church when our numbers are smaller than they used to be? And most people of faith carry questions with them about who this Jesus is and what this faith really means for our lives. COVID-19 has seemed to unearth many of these questions for people, too.

Learning to live with our questions, dwell in them, pray with them, and let them unfold in our hearts and our lives together is part of our call in following Jesus. So, during this Easter Season, we are going to take time to dwell with some of Jesus' questions. And in dwelling with Jesus' questions, we will also garner courage and hope as we dwell with our own questions. And who knows, maybe we will even come up with some answers that work for this season in our lives.
