Our Pastoral Nominating Committee (Bob Bengston and Ellen Prowant, co-moderators, Don Schneider, Betty Dunn, Karlie Arnst, Don Swick, Ara Demirjian and Jon Mills) hit the ground running on Tuesday, June 7 at their first formal meeting. They met with Rev. Troy Brydon Hauser, our Presbytery Committee on Ministry (COM) Liaison. The PNC will meet every week at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesdays.

Their first job is to complete a "Mission Information Form" that can tell prospective pastor candidates about our church and its mission. When they get that done, it will need to be approved by the Session and the COM. Then, they can start receiving applications.

Here's a little forewarning: The work of the PNC is kept confidential from us and from me as the Interim Pastor. The purpose of that is to give them free space to really listen to the Holy Spirit and trust the Spirit's work among them. So, we may not have too much information for a while.

Pastor's Corner

"I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. " – Philippians 1:6

Dear friends in Christ,

Years ago I moved into a house that had the most glorious peonies in the yard. White and magenta, they burst open each spring. One day a friend came over and said, "I just love your peonies." "Thank you!," I said. And yes, I did tend to those peonies. I watered them. Gave them fertilizer from time to time. Some years I trimmed them. I made sure they had wire rings around them so they wouldn't fall over.

But were they "my" peonies? I didn't plant them. I didn't nurture them from the start or get them through the tough early years. I surely didn't make the seed pop open and form flowers. I was just tending something I had been given, a gift that became mine.

This past Sunday two friends of mine joined us in worship and said, "We really loved being at your church today." They gave compliments about the music, the stained-glass windows, the kindness they received from greeters and my sermon. Of course I said, "Thank you."

But then I thought, "Is this my church?" I ask that question not just because I'm new and, as a transitional pastor, temporary. Whose church is this anyway? Yes, it belongs to all of you who have worked so faithfully, prayed and worshipped for decades and tended this building and the ministry with intelligence, imagination, and love.

But who, really, is the author of our worship? Who, really, is the founder of our work? Whose church is this, anyway? Maybe, as with my peonies, we are just tending something we've been given.

The Bible text above, from Paul to the church in Philippi, reflects that it is God who began the good work. Paul planted the church, but didn't start the church. Jesus did that. And as Genesis 1 reminds us, in the beginning, God creates.

So, at the risk of sounding trite, let me remind all of us: We belong to God, and our church belongs to God. God started this work, and by the grace of God many people, including us, have faithfully tended this gift given to us and the world.

And the promise of this text is that God IS STILL at work among us. Still creating. Still blowing new life. We can see that work in our worship and music and in the efforts of our Mission Council. Or how the Property Council cares for our vehicle for mission: our building. We can see that work as we interact with the community and share love in the form of meals, prayers, fun times together, and more.

God will continue to work among us. Our job is to remember that this is God's church and that our part is to listen deeply for the call of God's Spirit. We are just those who tend. Our work as God's people is not something we achieve, but is a grace we receive as we tend this church and ministry that belongs to Almighty God.

God's not done with us yet! What a blessing to be on this journey with you.

Worship in the Park


Mark your calendar for Worship in the Park at the Elks Park on August 7th at 10am. We will be sharing music, the message and Holy Communion!
