Have you thought much lately about the connection of love and giving? When we love someone – really love them – we are able to dig down deep and give time and resources for them in ways we might not have thought possible. I've been moved and honored in the past weeks to watch Don Olson and his three girls give so generously of their time and focus and resources to care for Marie as she sought to recover from a number of strokes. As you know, we are in stewardship season here at First Presbyterian Church in Muskegon. This is a season when we talk a lot about giving and we make decisions about the financial and time resources we will give to this church during the following year. Many of us crunch the numbers of our family finances and say, "OK, how much can I afford to give to the church in 2023?"

Being wise with our resources is important, of course. But, as followers of Christ, we are invited to consider our pledges and resources from a stance of love. The question we may wish to pray about is, "What is God inviting me to give this year?" Our giving is to grow from God's love within us and from our love for God, Christ's church and our community. We give because we have been loved and are invited to give back in love in return. We may arrive at the same amount of money and time if we ask, "What can I afford?" but it comes from a different place.

How does the Presbytery of Lake Michigan spend our apportionment/per capita dollars?

You have probably noted on your pledge cards this year that each member is being asked to pay, in addition to their pledge, the Presbytery of Lake Michigan's per capita amount, which is \$39.10 for 2023. This covers work done on our behalf by the presbytery, but also by the General Assembly and Synod.

Last month we looked at how the General Assembly's portion (\$9.85) of the money is spent. Next month we will explore how the Synod of the Covenant's portion (\$3.25) is spent. This month we will consider how the Presbytery of Lake Michigan spends its \$26.00 of that amount. Each day as a congregation we benefit from the support of our presbytery in ways we don't even realize. Similar to how our tax dollars pay for roads and other things we take for granted, per capita pays for things in the church that we assume will always be there.

Here are some of the things our presbytery does:

1. Congregational Support

- 1. The Commission on Ministry (made up of elders and pastors from the presbytery) supports churches going through transition, which includes looking for pastors, or experiencing struggles. The COM is supporting First Presbyterian of Muskegon and our PNC as we look for a pastor.
- 2. Mediation Team: Available for churches and individuals in churches that need help working through disagreements and challenges.
- 3. Congregational Vitality programs: Matthew 25 churches are among these. Grants are available to support churches in doing new things.
- 4. Offering seminars (like the church finance seminar that will be happening here in November) and other training opportunities to support church leaders.
- 5. The Korean Presbyterian Church in Lansing and North Presbyterian Church (a small church composed mostly of persons who struggle with mental illnesses) in Kalamazoo get special funding for their unique ministries.

2. Leadership Development and Support:

- 1. The Committee on Preparation for Ministry walks with people who are preparing for the ministry. It pays one-third of counseling assessment costs and helps support seminarians in a variety of ways that are not limited to helping pay for ordination exams and tuition support.
- Boundary training for all pastors is mandated by the presbytery, and the Presbytery pays for it.
- 3. In a partnership with our synod, the presbytery provides training through Leaderwise, a top notch church leadership training organization, in many areas of leadership development.
- 4. The Presbytery of Lake Michigan sets money aside to support justice ministries in the presbytery and to help train leaders in these areas. The churches in Lansing and Benton Harbor have benefitted from these monies in the past.
- 5. Youth leadership development through offering support for Youth Triennium, Montreat Youth Program, Urban Plunge and more.
- 6. The presbytery maintains a resource center that offers a wide range of books, curriculum for Sunday School, youth and adult education, DVDs and other materials to anyone in the Presbytery.
- 7. The presbytery pays for speakers and other worship leaders who inspire us during presbytery meetings.

3. Mission and Outreach

- 1. The Presbytery of Lake Michigan offers substantial support to two campus ministers whose work supports campus ministries at Western Michigan University, Grand Valley State University, Grand Rapids Community College and K College.
- 2. Grants are available to local congregations that wish to try new mission initiatives.

- 4. Judicatory Support
 - 1. Our per capita helps pay legal expenses for the Presbytery.
- 5. Maintenance of presbytery operations and office
 - 1. Our per capita dollars help pay the salaries of our executive presbyter and stated clerk and other presbytery staff.
 - 2. Our presbytery office is located at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Portage. Our presbytery pays a little rent to use this facility. It is a very cost-effective use of space and also helps support the ministry of the Portage church.

Even if you do not pledge, you are strongly encouraged to pay your per capita amount to the church so we do not need to cover your portion from our general operating expenses.



Our redesigned pledge cards were sent out and everyone should have received them by now. Finance Council is in the process of meeting with each council moderator to discuss their current expenses compared to their budget, and to project their needs for the 2023 budget. Much of this depends on our pledges coming in. We face many challenges ahead, chief among them is inflation. We have done well reviewing and reducing church expenses over the last few years, as well as redirecting our long-term funds into conservative income generating investments. But our pledges make up over 85% of our operating budget and receiving your pledges early in the budgeting process provides considerable clarity going forward. Please thoughtfully consider the financial needs of our church in your pledges and return them as soon as possible.

Over the first nine months this year, our expenses are lower than expected due in part to a vacant staff position and cost conserving in other areas, but the energy intensive three months remain. We are currently under budget by \$13,911 and revenue is ahead by \$11,042. The increased income was due in large part to non-pledge gifts received in the last few months. Many thanks for those generous gifts.

Adam is excited to join the FPC Muskegon staff and to be a part of the Spirit of renewal that is flowing through our congregation.


